Join us as we explore the west end of the Olympic Peninsula, specifically Forks, Washington’s spectacularly scenic Ruby Beach and Olympic National Park’s Hoh Rain Forest. Paul will demonstrate painting on location at one of the most popular beaches on the Olympic Peninsula, which boasts some of the most awesome views of the Pacific Coast with the easiest access. Just a few miles away from the small town of Forks, Ruby Beach is an easy hike. This day trip will precede our two day adventure into the Olympic Peninsula’s Hoh Rain Forest. It is a wet and wild forest with huge 500-year-old trees. With about 150 inches of annual rainfall, timber grows there faster than anywhere else. Olympic National Park is recognized internationally as a Biosphere Reserve and World Heritage Site because of the rain forest and eye candy for any artist!

If watermedia is your passion, then this highly energized painting workshop is for you! Paul's stress-free, positive approach toward the act of painting will inspire you to loosen up and have fun again. Expect an intense, concentrated and lively workshop where you will elevate your understanding of how watercolor can be controlled.

Paul is the author of *Painting Spectacular Light Effects in Watercolor*. His work is often featured in *International Artist* and *The Artist’s Magazine*. He is a signature member of the American Watercolor Society and National Watercolor Society.
